The Central Lancashire Local Plan Regulation 19 Publication Version Consultation

The Lancashire County Combined Authority (LCCA), as a new strategic authority, was formally established in February 2025. The LCCA acts as a single organisation for all of Lancashire supporting economic growth and providing more local decision making through devolved powers. The consultation on the draft Lancashire Growth Plan 2025-2035 has just closed on 11 April. It draws on a substantial evidence base and understanding of growth priorities developed with the LCCA Business Board, District Councils, and higher and further education institutions. It sets out how a thriving Lancashire is fundamental to the UK's economic success and how it has the potential to achieve significant growth. Work will continue to agree and take the Growth Plan forward.

The Central Lancashire area hosts significant local, regional and national growth assets and has the potential and opportunity to support Lancashire's economic ambitions and growth priorities. The LCCA would welcome the opportunity to make representations on the Local Plan but unfortunately, as a new body, the timeline for the LCCA's approval processes does not align with the deadline for responding to the Central Lancashire Local Plan consultation.

I would be grateful if you could acknowledge the interest of the LCCA and the relevance of the Growth Plan to the Local Plan and allow the LCCA to come forward with representations and to contribute to the Local Plan process as it continues to move forward.
