


Chorley

Chorley Borough is located in the part of northwest England where southern Lancashire adjoins Greater Manchester. The large urban centres of Blackburn, Bolton, Wigan and Preston are all within a 12-mile radius. The Borough extends to about 205 km² (approximately 80 square miles).




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ADLINGTON, ANDERTON AND HEATH CHARNOCK



Adlington railway station ensures that a higher than average proportion of residents within the community use the train to travel to work compared to the borough average. House prices in the community are almost £50,000 more than the borough average while crime rates are lower. Regarding open space provision the village fares well when compared with sport ground provision throughout the borough due to Chorley Golf Course. The villages' benefit from a large number of amenities including 50 shops, a library, four primary schools and two post offices. Many occupiers own their houses outright; almost 7% more than the borough average.

The community composed of Adlington, Anderton and Heath Charnock fares well in the Indices of Deprivation 2007 with the rank in 9 out of 10 categories being above the borough rank. Of economically inactive residents a larger percentage are retirees, reflecting the slightly higher number of the population aged 55 or above compared with figures for the borough as a whole. The level of qualifications and social grades within the community are similar to those throughout the borough.



SOCIAL GRADE (AGED 16+) (Census 2001)





Average house prices in Astley Village are over £10,000 less than the borough average while average household income is above the borough average by £500 per year. According to crime statistics, the rate of crime in Astley Village is above the borough average. However, the Indices of Multiple Deprivation (IMD) 2007 suggests that crime rates in Astley Village fare favourably compared to the borough as a whole. The IMD also identifies that Astley Village performs poorly in the area of housing and services availability. This may be due to the lack of services such as a library, dentist, bank, cash machine and petrol station, as well as a lack of retail outlets within the parish. This does not take into account services located within nearby Chorley town centre or the nearby Tesco superstore.

A large proportion of the housing stock is detached with over 30% being social rented accommodation, almost 25% higher than the borough average. The proportion of residents in a higher managerial or professional social grade is 5% higher than the borough average. However, the relative number of unskilled workers or unemployed is also higher. The northwest of the parish is greenbelt land.







SOCIAL GRADE (AGED 16+) (Census 2001)





There is a lack of shops and services in the area resulting in higher levels of car ownership (93.95%) compared to the Chorley Borough average (80.37%). The area has a slightly higher proportion of middle and old-aged residents resulting in a larger percentage of retirees. A larger percentage of housing is detached compared to the borough average and the average house price is over £50,000 more. Despite this a larger share of the Brindle population own their house outright. A large percentage of residents are in higher managerial or supervisory positions, while over double the borough average are self-employed. This results in a higher household income than the borough average, with earnings of around £42,000. Crime rates are below the borough average and Brindle fares better than the borough in seven out of ten indices of deprivation.

The surrounding area is Green Belt, with a significant area to the east of the village, Chorley moraine, identified as a Geological Heritage Site. Smaller biological and geological heritage sites are scattered across the surrounding area including Haddock Park Wood and Mill Wood.









There appears to be a lack of facilities within the parishes of Charnock Richard and Heskin although the nearby centres of Eccleston and Coppull may cater for resident's needs. Car ownership is above the borough average with a large percentage (71%) of residents using their vehicles to travel to work. Average household income is just over £1000 above the borough average while house prices are just under £15,000 more. Crime rates in the parish are similar to those throughout the borough. Charnock Richard Golf Club covers over 60ha, while Yarrow Valley Golf Course is also located close by.

A large proportion of the dwelling stock is detached or semi-detached with a high percentage of residents owning their homes. The share of social rented dwellings provided by housing associations is below the borough average. The indices of deprivation illustrate that the availability of housing and services is poor while the parishes also fare poorly in the living environment and crime and disorder domains. The community is home to a higher proportion of resident's aged 55-80, while the percentage of younger people is below the average for the borough. Although qualifications of local residents are similar to the borough average social grades are generally higher.





A higher percentage of residents living in Clayton Brook/Green travel by car when compared with the average figure for the borough and car ownership is more common. House prices and earnings are marginally higher than the borough average while the crime rate is considerably less than that recorded throughout the borough. Regarding open space, residents of Clayton Brook/Green are well catered for in terms of parkland thanks to Cuerden Valley Park 260ha, although the area only possesses a small area of sports grounds.

Detached housing is by far the most common housing type in the parish (44%) with many residents owning their homes with a loan. The area performs poorly in the indices of deprivation 2007 scoring lower than the borough in 8 out of the 10 domains. Levels of qualification and economic activity within the area are similar to that of the whole borough although generally, residents of the parish are classed as a higher social grade compared to rest of the borough.





A larger percentage of the population of Clayton-le-Woods and Cuerden use a bus, mini bus or coach to travel to work compared with the figure for the whole borough. The average house price in the area is £195,200 compared with the borough average of £176,500. Recorded crime levels are significantly lower in the area than throughout the borough, while the average household income is £37,668 compared with the borough average of £35,028. 

The level of car ownership in Coppull is relative to that throughout the borough, as is the use of a car to travel to work. The popularity of different travel methods used by Coppull residents to get to work is also similar to the average of the borough, although the use of a bus, mini-bus or coach is slightly higher. House prices within Coppull Parish are lower than average prices throughout the borough by almost £10,000 and local household incomes fall below the borough average of £35,028 by over £1500. The occurrence of social rented local authority housing is almost twice that of the corresponding figure for the borough.

Coppull Parish achieved poor scores in the indices of deprivation 2007, with it ranking below the borough in 8 of the 10 domains. A higher percentage of parish residents (38%) hold no qualification compared to the borough (28%) and social grades tend to be lower, with a high percentage of those aged 16 or above being skilled or unskilled manual workers. Parts of Yarrow Valley Park are located within the parish providing a healthy area of parkland available to resident






Age Structure for Coppull and Chorley Borough





A slightly higher proportion of those living in Croston or Bretherton work from home (13%) compared with the borough average (9%), while car ownership levels are relatively high. Average house prices in the area are £244,700 with the average household income at £39,000 per year. Housing type and tenure tend to reflect the pattern displayed throughout the borough.

The age structure of the area shows that there is a lack of resident's aged 20-29 compared with figures for the borough. This may be due to the lack of housing options as Bretherton and Croston scored poorly in this domain of the indices of deprivation 2007. A high proportion of residents are self-employed, while the proportion of retirees amongst the economically inactive is higher than the corresponding figure for the borough. Generally, Croston and Bretherton residents are of a higher social grade than the average throughout the borough and report marginally better levels of health.



A large percentage (71%) of Eccleston residents travel to work by car compared with the borough average (65%) and car ownership is considerably higher. In many cases the amount of open space per person in Eccleston is less than the borough average. Average house prices in Eccleston are almost £40,000 above the borough average while income is only marginally higher than average. 

Average housing prices in Euxton are marginally above those throughout the borough, while household earnings are higher than the borough average by over £2,500. Crime rates in the parish are well below the borough average and a higher proportion of residents reported their health as good compared to the borough overall. There is a higher proportion of detached and semi-detached dwellings while slightly more residents own their home outright or with a loan than the average throughout the borough. The parish attained a higher score than the borough average in all domains of the indices of deprivation.

The age structure of the parish is comparable to that of the borough. A higher percentage (50%) of economically inactive residents are retired compared with the borough figure of 44%. Although the level of qualifications attained by residents of the parish are similar to the borough average, a higher proportion of those living in Euxton are of a higher social grade.



Due to the rural nature of the parish a large percentage (15%) of the community choose to work from home. Despite this a large percentage of the residents use a car or van to travel to work (71%) compared with the borough average (66%). Only 10% of households have no car compared with Chorley borough's average figure of 20%. The need for a car is likely due to the lack of facilities within the community. On average households in Heapey and Wheelton earn over £10,000 more each year compared with the average borough household. House prices in Heapey and Wheelton are over £90,000 more than the average house price in the borough while many of the houses in the parish are large detached dwellings, which may make it difficult for those looking to move into the area. This is reflected in the Indices of Deprivation rankings as the area performs poorly in the Barriers to Housing and Services Domain.

The number of residents aged 0-4 and 30-44 is above the borough average. A large number of economically active residents are self-employed, while many inactive residents look after the home and family. On average residents of Heapey and Wheelton possess better qualifications than the borough average and a large percentage are in higher managerial or professional social grade





A larger proportion of Houghton residents work from home than the borough average and almost 40% travel between 5km and 10km to work suggesting many commute to the nearby centres of Preston or Blackburn. This has resulted in higher car ownership with almost 95% of households owning a car. Average house prices are around £300,000, almost £125,000 above the borough average, and average household earnings exceed the boroughs by over £7,000. Over 50% of the dwelling stock in the parish is detached, while many of the residents own their home outright or with a loan. The occurrence of private rented accommodation is higher than the borough average while almost 50% of housing has 7 or more rooms. 



Age Structure for Hoghton and Chorley Borough





Almost 14% of Mawdesley parish residents work from home. This compares with a borough average of just over 9%. The rate of car ownership is extremely high (93%) compared with the figure of 80% for the borough. Do to the rural nature of the area a high proportion of residents use a car or van to travel to work. Over 57% of the housing stock is detached dwellings compared with the borough figure of 29%. A larger share of Mawdesley's population own their homes outright compared with corresponding figures for the borough, and there is little, if any, social rented or shared ownership housing. According to the Indices of Deprivation 2007 the parish suffers from poor availability of housing and services.

Average household income and average house price within the parish are above the borough average and, according to MADE crime statistics, the parish has amongst the lowest recorded crime rates in the borough. A large share of parish residents are 44- 69 years of age while the proportion of those in younger age bands is generally below average figures for the borough. The share of parish residents at a higher managerial or professional social grade is significantly below the corresponding figure for the borough.





Due to the rural nature of both parishes facilities are sparse. The area ranked significantly below Chorley borough as a whole in the barriers to housing and services domain of the indices of deprivation 2007. Due to the lack of facilities in the community car ownership levels are extremely high (97%) and almost 73% of residents travel to work by car even though 18% work from home. In fact, over 70% of households own 2 or more vehicles.

Average house prices are almost twice the borough average (£351,500) and average household income is over £44,000. Almost 70% of housing within the parish is detached. The proportion of residents who own their homes is similar to the average throughout the borough, yet there is a higher occurrence of private rented housing. Over 61% of houses in Anglezarke and Rivington boast 7 or more rooms with the equivalent figure for the borough being 23%. Located in the parish of Rivington is Lever Park, 150 hectares of parkland.

The area also experiences high levels of home working, a high proportion of retirees, high social grades and a high percentage of residents reporting good health.





Age Structure for Rivington & Anglezarke and Chorley Borough



Ulnes Walton parish is largely rural. Car ownership levels are high (94%) although a large majority of residents (30%) travel to work on foot. Average house prices in the parish (£244,700) are significantly higher than the borough average, as are average household earnings (£39,007). Crime rates within the parish are well below the borough average. The housing type split within the parish is similar to that throughout the borough, although a larger proportion (56%) of the population own their homes with a loan and less homes are social rented properties.

There appears to be a limited amount of open space and services. This is reflected in the Indices of Deprivation 2007 as the parish fares poorly in the 'barriers to housing and services' and 'living environment' domains although this may be due to Wymott and Garth prisons. Population figures and characteristics are greatly affected by the prisoners of Wymott and Garth. Seventy-nine percent of the parish population is male, and the majority of the population are aged 20-44. The parish also displays ethnic and religious diversity.

Note: The parish of Ulnes Walton contains Wymott prison, which contains over 1000 male prisoners. This may greatly affect the census 2001 statistics



A higher percentage of Whittle-Le-Woods residents' use a car for their journey to work compared with the borough average and car ownership is higher. Average house prices are over £100,000 above the borough average while annual earnings are over £10,000 more. Compared with the borough, crime rates are low. A high proportion of the housing stock is detached or semi-detached and the proportion of those owning their homes with a loan is significantly higher. Compared with the borough the parish fares well in the indices of deprivation rankings. On average Whittle-Le-Woods residents have attained higher qualifications and are classed at a higher social grade than the borough average. The age structure of the parish is similar to the borough as a whole, although those living in Whittle-Le-Woods report a better level of health.

Numerous local nature reserves and biological heritage sites are located in the parish while almost 100Ha of land west of the M61 is safeguarded land.





A higher percentage of Withnell parish residents use a car for their journey to work compared with the borough average and car ownership is higher. The average house price is £249,950, almost £75,000 higher than the borough average. Crime rates in the parish are lower than those throughout the borough and average household income is over £41,000. A large percentage of the housing stock is terraced, while a slightly higher proportion of parish residents own their homes compared with the borough. Withnell parish ranked poorly in the indices of deprivation 2007 especially the domain relating to barriers to housing and services. This may be due to housing affordability issues or poor access to selected services.

The percentage of retirees contributing to the economically inactive population is higher in Withnell than the borough as a whole. On average a larger proportion of Withnell parish residents possess higher level qualifications than the borough and are classed in a higher social grade. Roddlesworth Valley and Withnell and Wheelton Moors are two of the local nature reserves/biological heritage sites located in the parish.





Age Structure for Withnell and Chorley Borough


