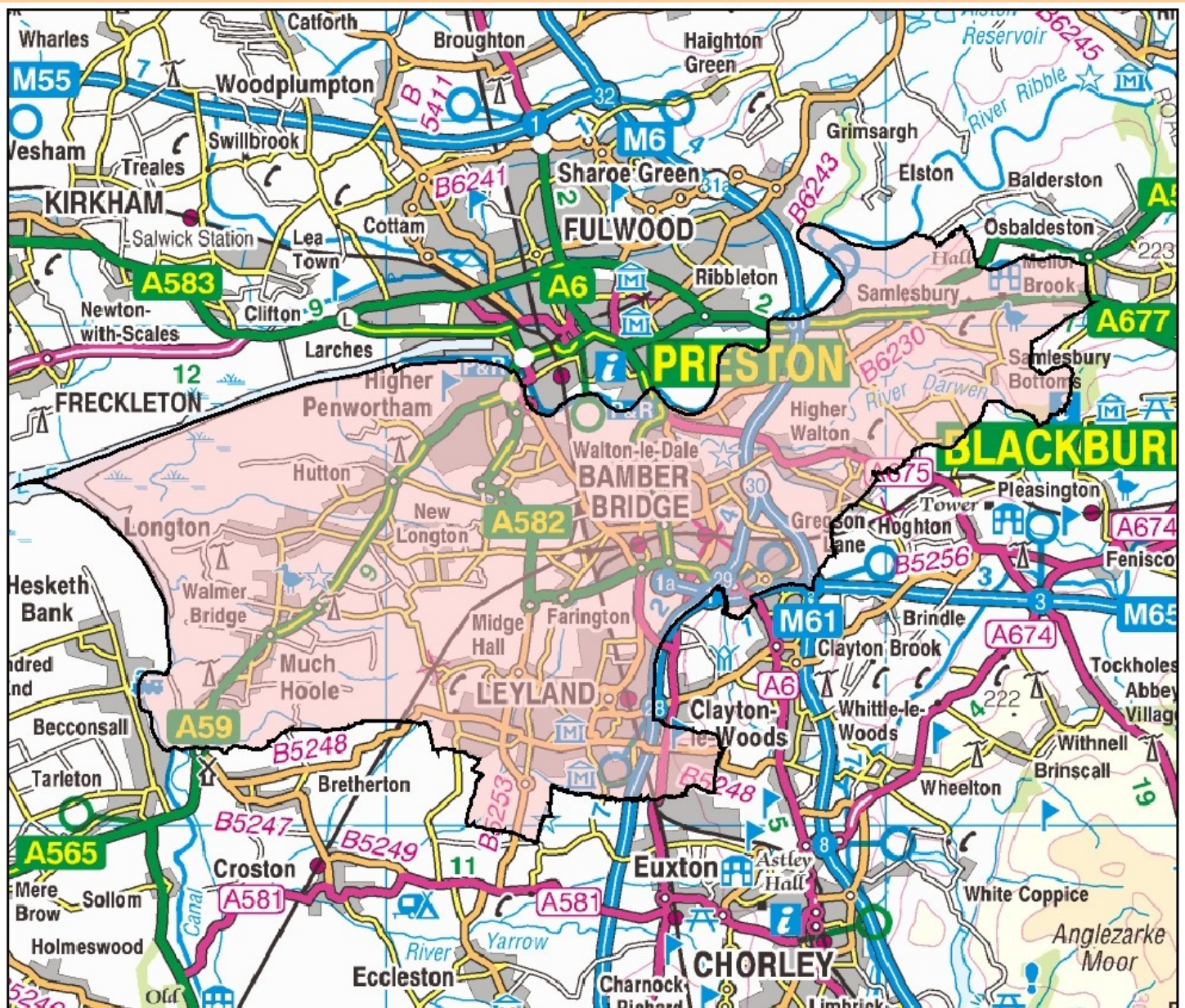


South Ribble

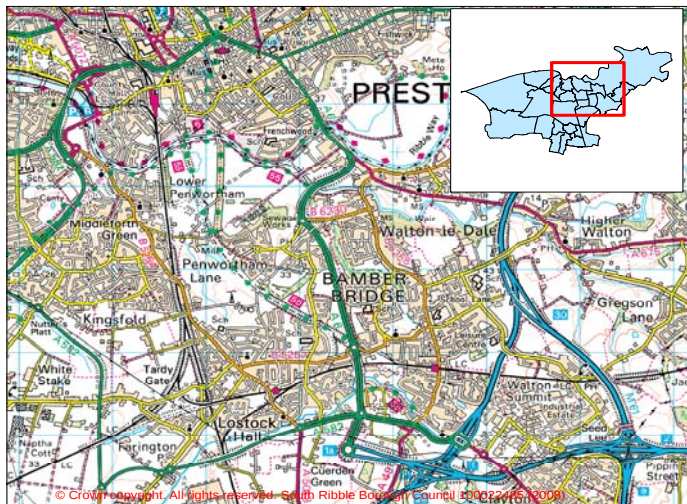


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BAMBER BRIDGE

Description and Context

- Bamber Bridge lies to the south of Preston, within the Borough of South Ribble. The Old English meaning of Bamber Bridge is 'Beam and Brycg' roughly translated as 'Tree trunk bridge'.
- Station Road is the main road through the village, and most of the shops are along the road. It crosses the railway at a level crossing next to the railway station. It was formerly part of the A6, until a bypass was built in the 1980s**

Bamber Bridge is an existing built up area and is bordered by small areas of private, educational and institutional open space, and public open space.

One of South Ribble's less affluent communities, house prices are approximately 12% lower than the borough average with a much higher percentage of semi detached housing. There is a good ethnic split although as with the rest of the borough, the majority are registered as 'white/Christian'. The number of people owning their own home, either with a mortgage or outright, appears to be reasonably high despite socially rented properties accounting for 12% of all households. Over half of economically active residents travel less than 5km to work with the majority of these being supervisory or junior management positions. Car availability numbers show approximately three quarters of households having 2 cars or more. Crime in the Bamber Bridge area appears to be considerable at 42% higher than the borough average.

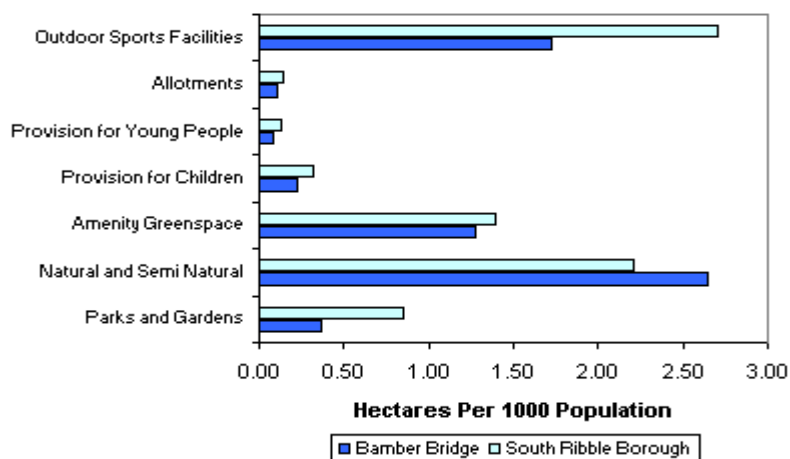

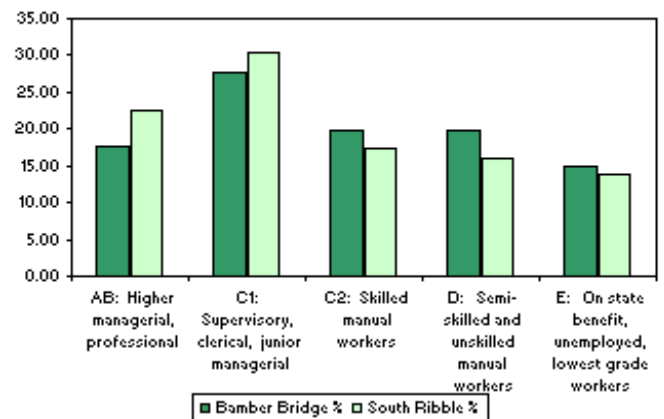

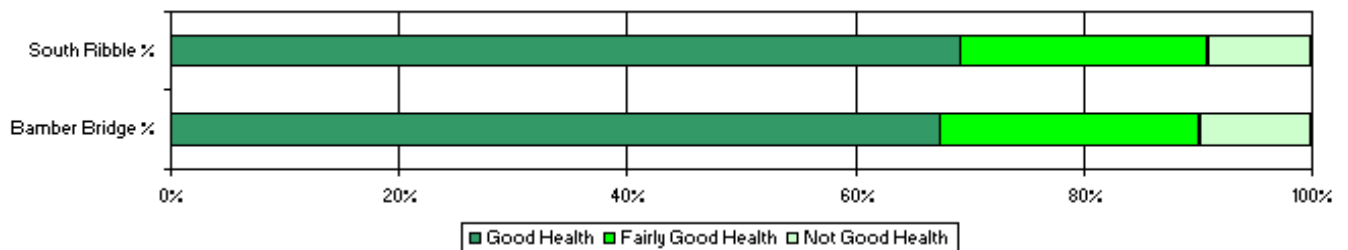

SOCIAL GRADE (AGED 16+)



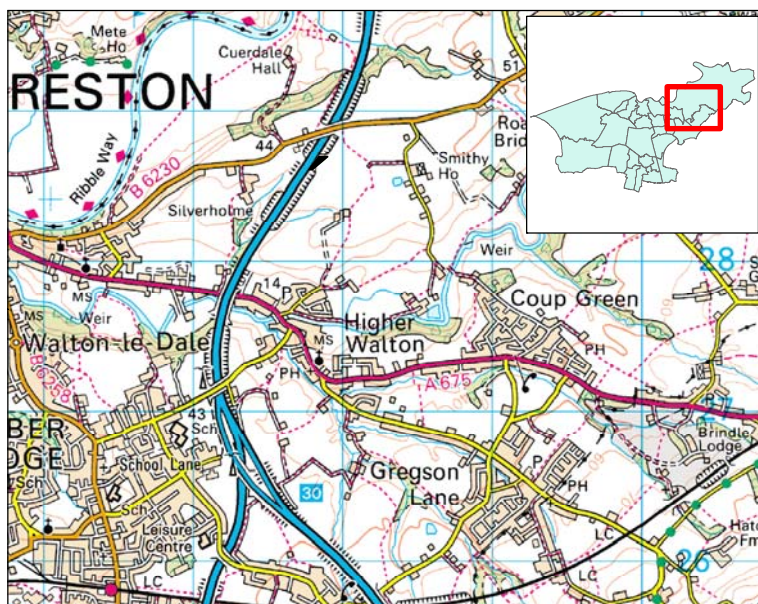

The area surrounding the village is greenbelt.

The percentage of detached dwellings in the village is almost twice that of the Borough average, whilst the percentage of terraced dwellings is significantly less than the Borough average. There are also a higher proportion of people who own their home, either with a mortgage or outright. House prices in Coup Green are 42% higher than the Borough average. Almost 90% of households have at least 1 car, which is higher than the Borough average.

There are a higher proportion of middle aged and old aged residents in Coup Green compared with the rest of South Ribble. A high percentage of residents are employed in managerial or supervisory positions.

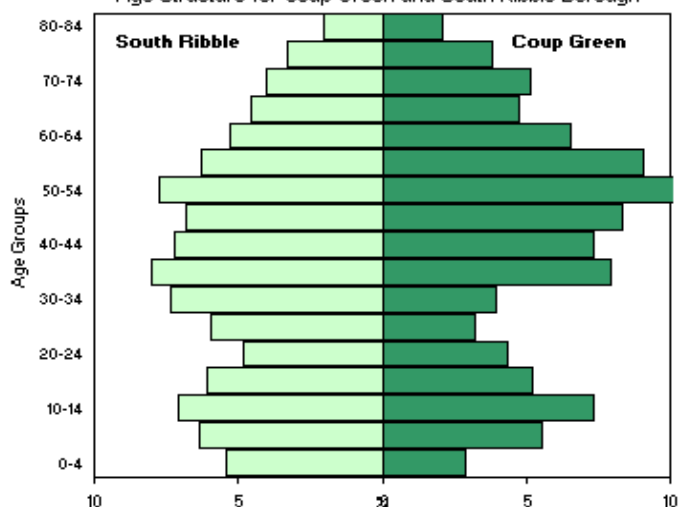

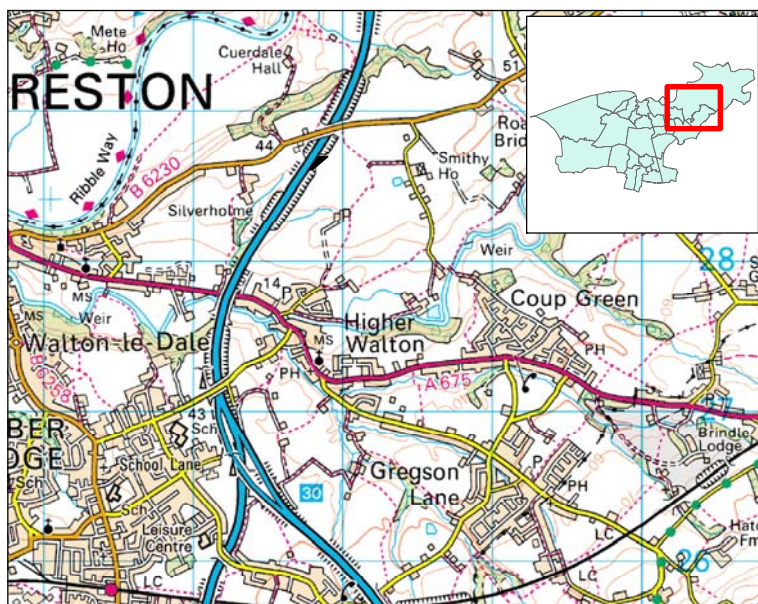

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- Gregson Lane is located within the township of Walton le Dale
- The village is situated between Bamber Bridge, Higher Walton, Coupe Green and Brindle, and is within four miles of the city of Preston.
- Although not recognised as a separate village, and sometimes known as part of Hoghton, Gregson Lane is administratively separate.
- Gregson Lane was the first route used by the newly formed Ribble Motor Service bus company in 1910.

Gregson Lane is identified as an existing built up area and is bordered by Green Belt Land. A mainly Christian community, over 17% of the area is occupied by retired inhabitants.

The village has a much higher percentage of semi-detached housing than the Borough average. Although house prices in the area are considerably below the borough average, the number of people owning their own home, either with a mortgage or outright, appears to be slightly above average. Over 73% of residents travel less than 10km to work although only 8% of these work mainly at, or from home. Car availability is higher in all areas considered compared to the borough average, with over 61% of households having 1 car or more. Crime in the Gregson Lane area is significantly lower than the borough average and there is a low ratio of people to land per hectare.

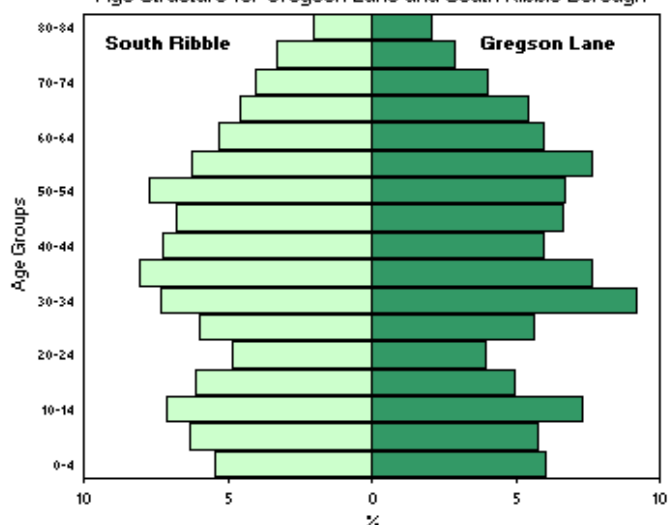

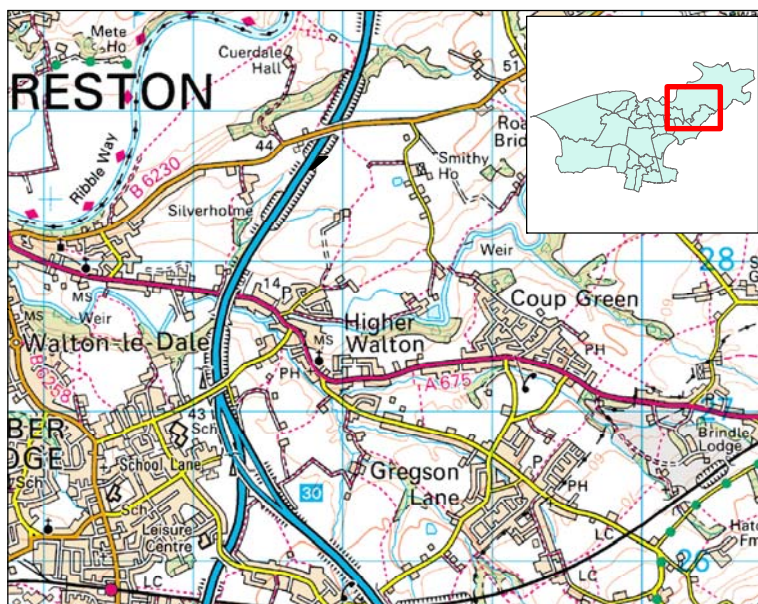

The area surrounding the village is identified as Greenbelt and Best and Most Versatile Agricultural Land. There is also a Wildlife Corridor running through the village, along the River Darwen, and much of the village is within flood zones 2 or 3.

The village has a much higher percentage of terraced housing than the Borough average, although house prices in the area are only slightly below the Borough average. The number of people owning their own home, either with a mortgage or outright, is slightly below the Borough average. Over 68% of residents travel less than 10km to work. A slightly higher proportion of households have no car, compared to the Borough average, although over 78% of households have 1 car or more. Crime in Samlesbury and Walton ward is significantly higher than the Borough average.

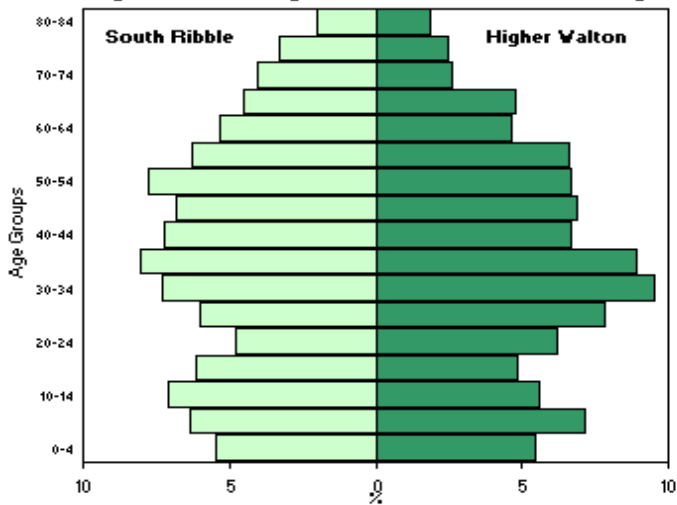

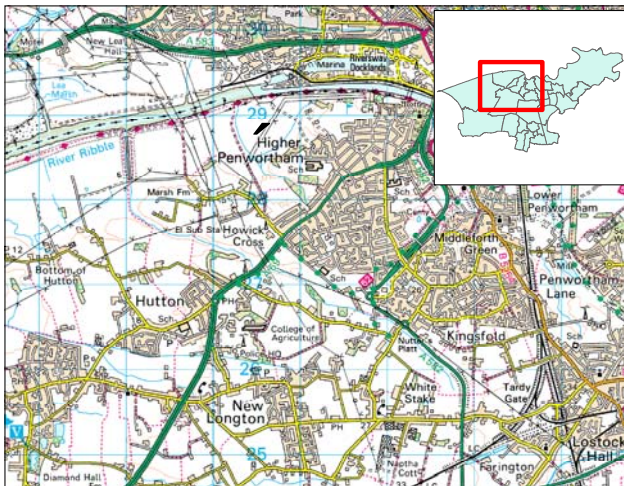

Hutton is identified as Green Belt and is bordered by a large area of best and most versatile agricultural land.

Despite being an affluent community, over 70% of the areas economically inactive inhabitants are retired compared to the South Ribble average of 15% who enjoy a lower than Borough average health.

The village has a much higher percentage of semi-detached housing than the Borough average yet these are larger in scale. Although house prices in the area are fairly equal to the Borough average, the number of people owning their own home, either with a mortgage or outright, appears to be considerably higher. Over half of economically active residents travel less than 10km to work with the majority of these being supervisory or junior management positions. Car availability is higher in all areas considered, with approximately half of households having 2 cars or more. Crime in the Much Hoole area is significantly lower than the Borough average.

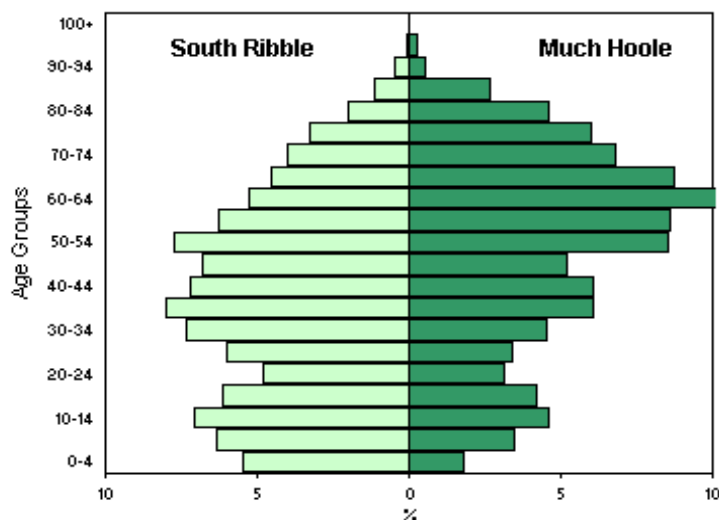

Leyland is identified as being an existing built up area and is bordered by areas of safeguarded and employment areas.

One of South Ribble's larger communities, house prices vary enormously but on average are approximately 3% lower than the borough average with nearly half being semi detached housing. There is a good ethnic split although as with the rest of the borough, the majority registered as 'white/Christian'. The number of people owning their own home, either with a mortgage or outright, appears to be reasonably high despite socially rented properties accounting for 12% of all households.

Car availability numbers show approximately one third of households having 2 cars or more. Crime in the Leyland area appears to be about 15% higher than the Borough average but the statistics vary considerably between individual districts.

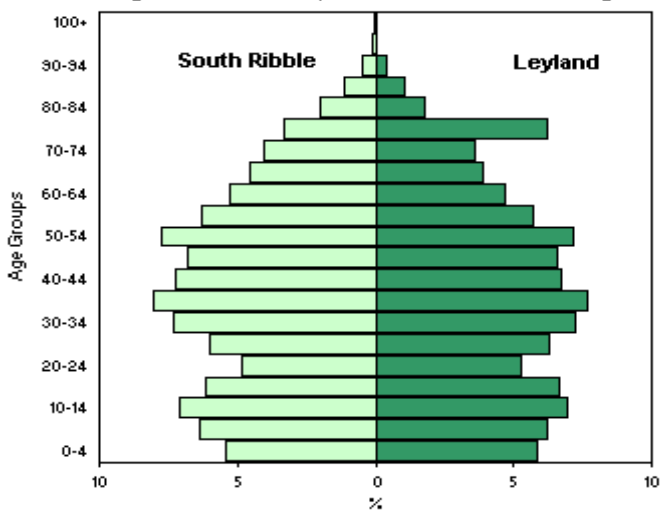

Longton is located some 3 miles west of the city of Preston. It is an existing built up area bordered by green belt land. The population has a low ethnic minority with over 99% of residents being identified as 'white'. The residents of Longton enjoy above average health

A reasonably affluent community, the village has a much higher percentage of semi-detached housing than the borough average with nearly half of households being mortgaged. House prices in the area equal the borough average. Over 75% of residents travel less than 10km to work and 60% of those employed work full time compared to the South Ribble figure of 45%. 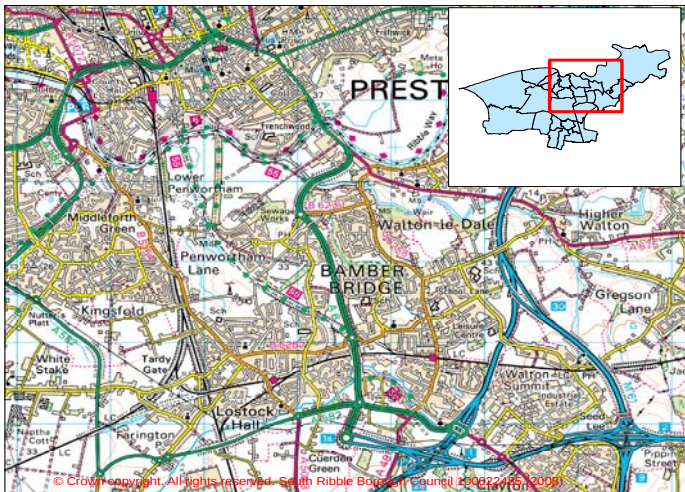

One of South Ribble's larger communities, house prices vary enormously but on average are approximately 15% lower than the borough average with nearly half being semi detached housing. 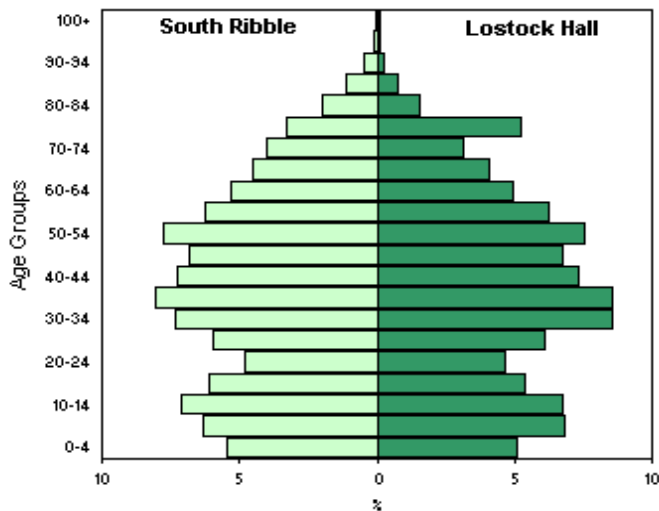

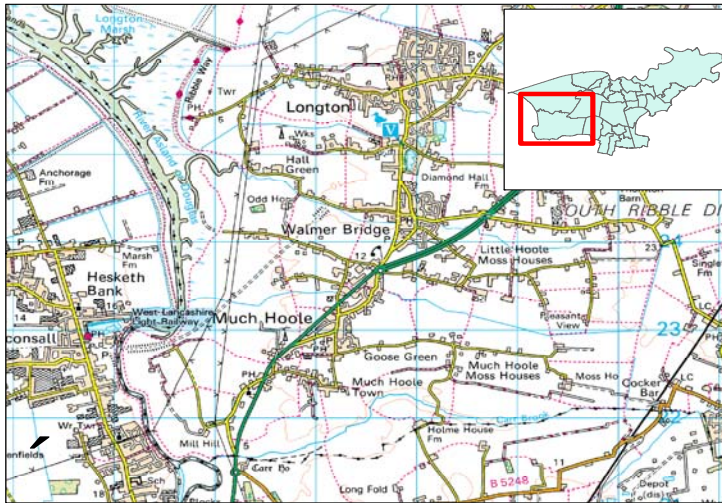

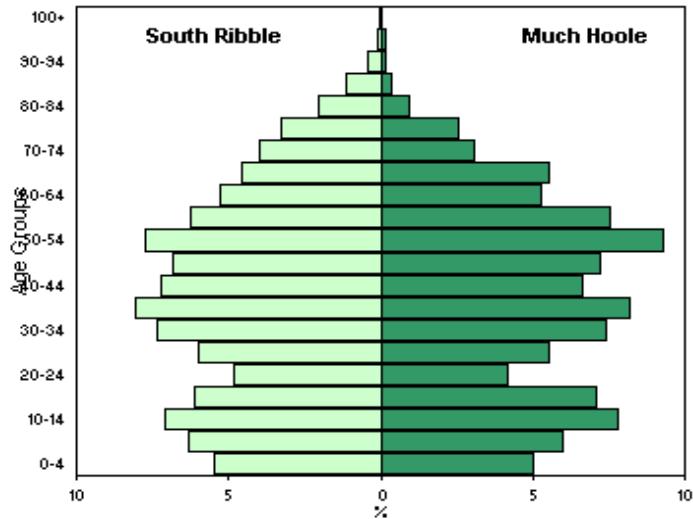

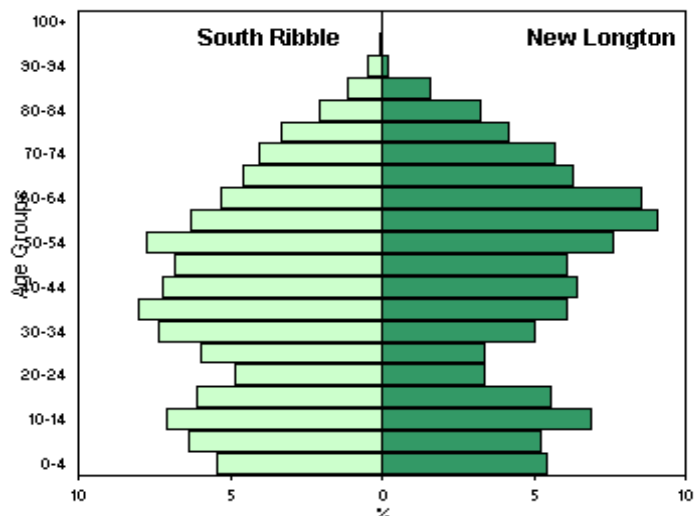

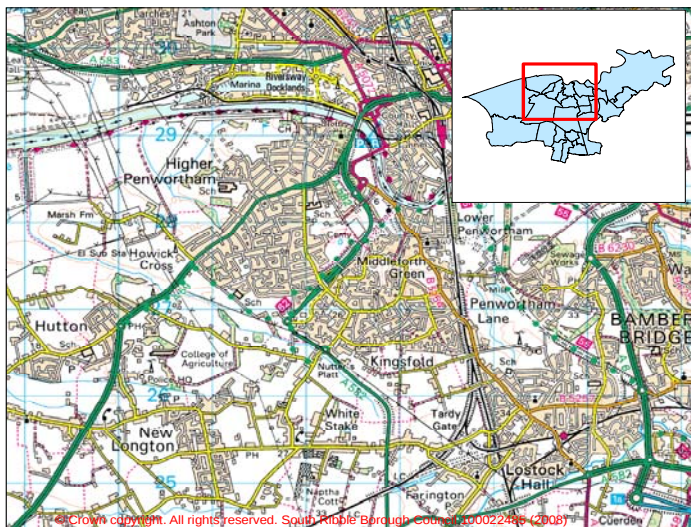

Penwortham is identified as being an existing built up area and is bordered by green belt and areas of safeguarded land.

One of South Ribble's larger communities, house prices vary enormously but on average are approximately 6% lower than the borough average with nearly one quarter of all housing stock being detached. There is a good ethnic split in Penwortham and nearly 70% of economically active residents work full time. The number of people owning their own home, either with a mortgage or outright, appears to be reasonably high with socially rented properties accounting for only 10% of all households – less than the borough average.

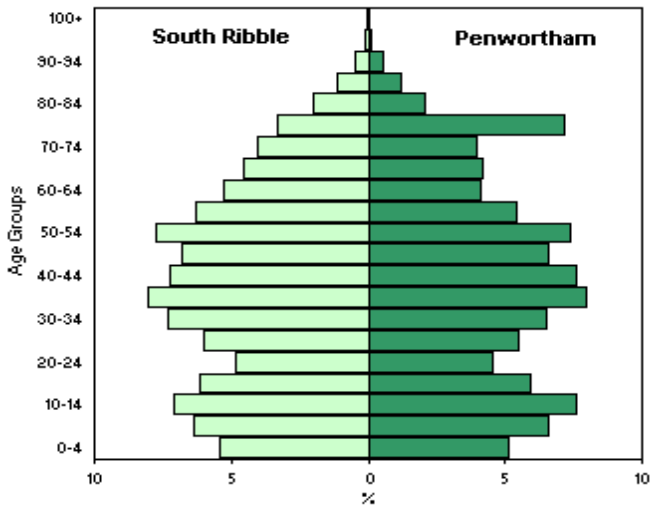

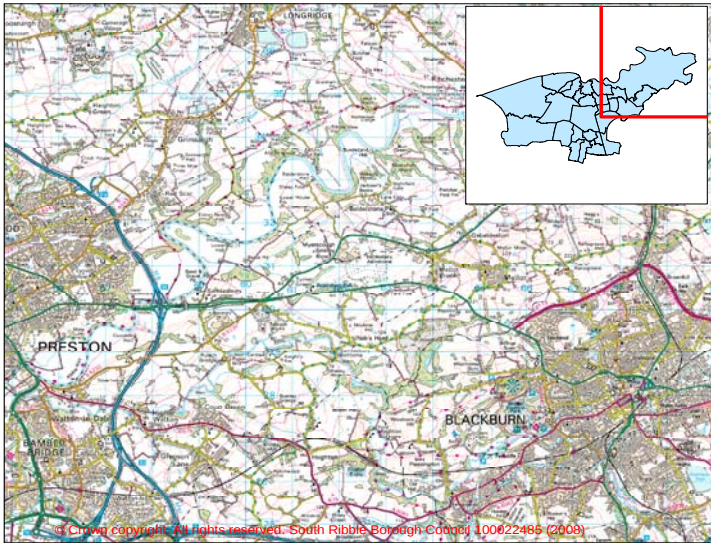

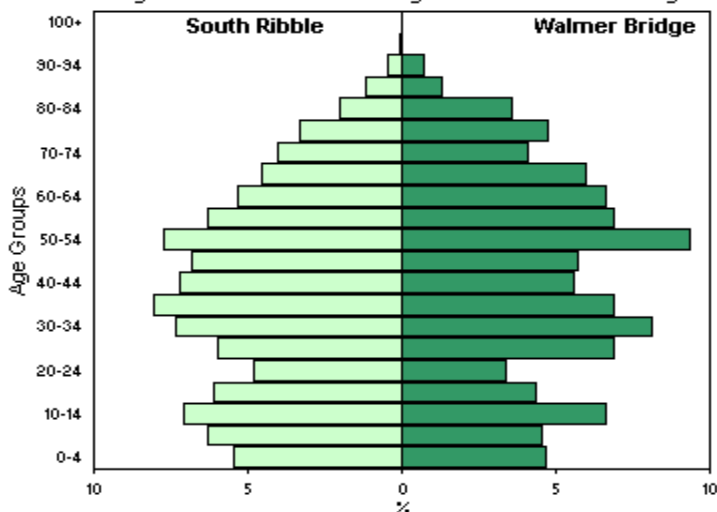

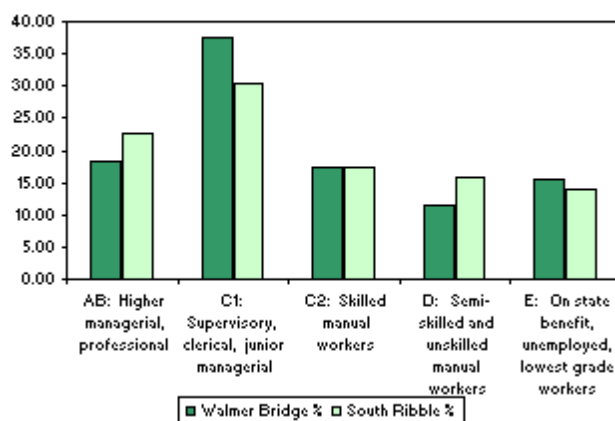

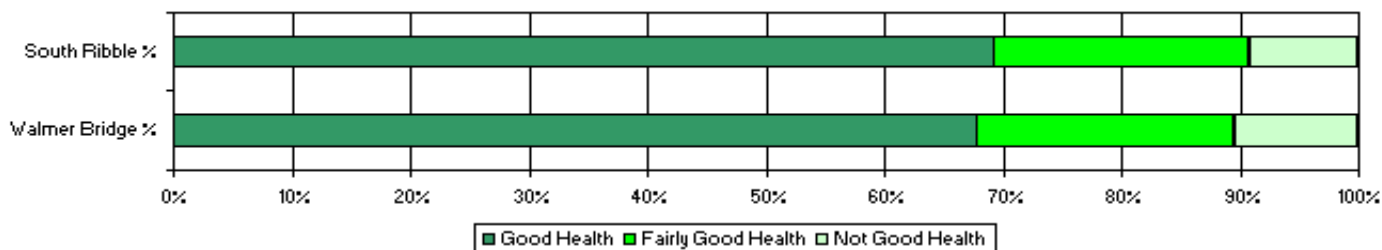

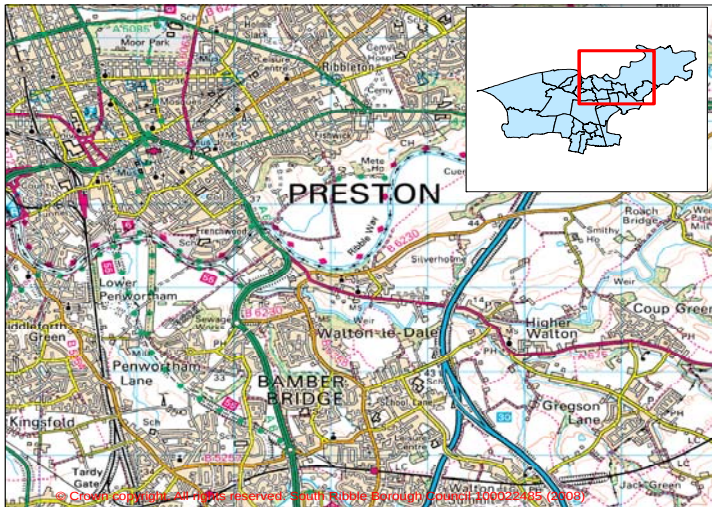

Despite being a reasonably affluent community, over half of the areas economically inactive inhabitants are retired compared to the South Ribble average of 15%. The residents of Walton-le-Dale enjoy a higher than borough average health.

The village has a high proportion of semi-detached housing and of a lower value with the number of people owning their own home, either with a mortgage or outright, considerably higher than average. Over half of economically active residents travel less than 10km to work with the majority of these being supervisory or junior management positions.

Car availability is higher in all areas considered, with approximately half of households having 2 cars or more. Crime in the Walton le Dale area is significantly lower than the Borough average

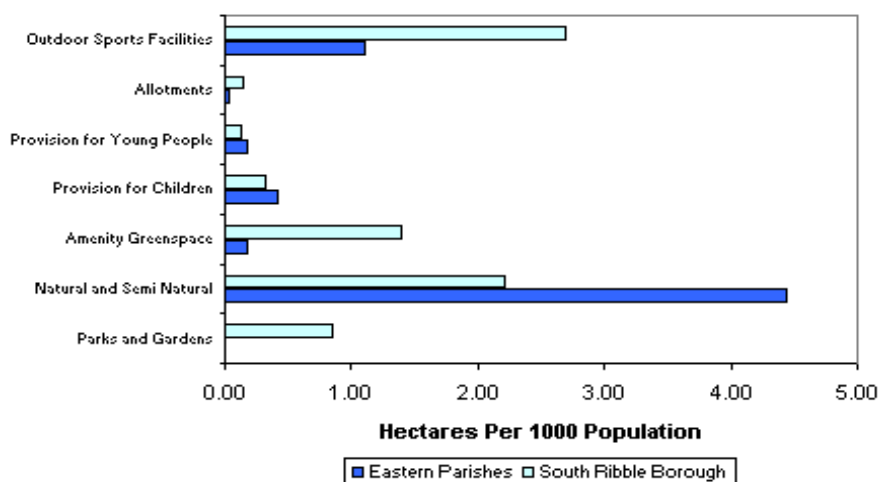

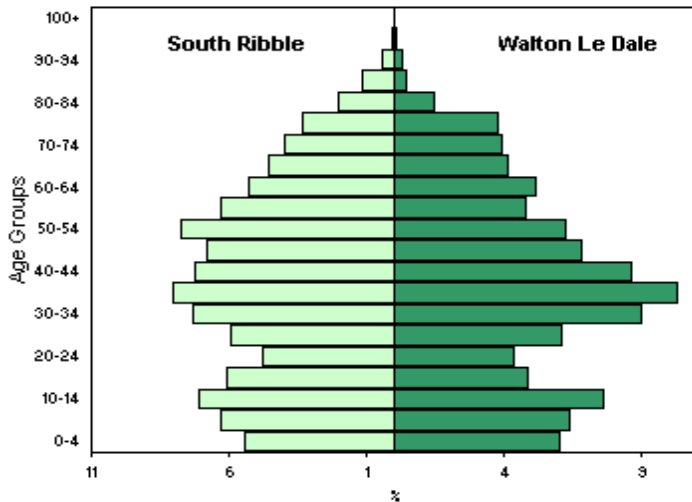

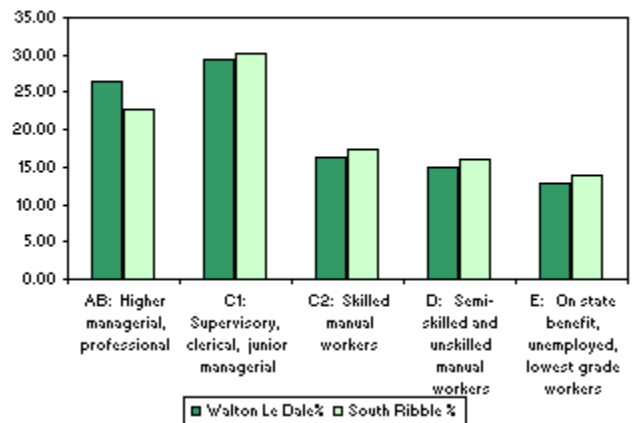
