


Preston

Broughton parish is semi-rural and just off the exit from the M55 and close to the M6 motorway. Although close to Preston, there are a lack of amenities and facilities for the local population. This results in higher than average car ownership (91.65%) compared to the Preston average (68.57%), though its position close to two major motorways will have informed this figure. It also has nearly double Preston's average (4.41%) of people working from home (7.88%). It has a high proportion of middle and old-aged residents resulting in a large percentage of retirees (64.69%), this in turn leads to a high percentage of people owning their own home (52.73%) compared to Preston (29.37%). The average house price, of mainly detached houses (53.43%), for this area is £289,246. Employed residents are mainly in higher managerial or supervisory positions (65.91%); while the self-employed average is nearly double that of Preston's (16.75%). This results in a high average household income at around £38,588, which although higher than Preston's, is not as high as adjoining parishes.

Crime rates are below Preston's average with Broughton doing better than the Preston average in nine out of ten indices of deprivation. The percentage of people enjoying good or fairly good health (93.03%) is higher when compared to the Preston average (89.67%).









Description and Context



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- Barton is a small to medium-sized settlement and civil parish that was formed within the Preston district.
- The parish had a population of 1,096 according to the 2001 census and is about six miles north of Preston.
- The parish is bound by the A6 road to the west and the M6 motorway also passes through the parish, splitting the village, west of the motorway, from the rest of the parish.
- A key feature of Barton is St Lawrence church that has a memorial of the 14/20th King's Hussars. Next to the church stands the Boars Head pub and is so named from the days when wild boars used to roam the district.

Barton is classed as semi-rural with the surrounding area being open countryside. There is severe lack of shops and services in the area, but it does have a high level of regular and frequent bus services to Preston. This means that car ownership (54.9%) is lower than the Preston average (68.57%), though conversely the majority of workers do drive (48.87%) rather than take the bus to work (0.88%). It has a high proportion of middle and old-aged residents resulting in a high level of retirees (67.35%). The percentage of detached housing (69.56%) is four times that of Preston (17.34%) with the average house price being £289,246. Despite this a high percentage of people (49.89%) own their own home outright compared to the Preston average (29.37%). A large percentage of employment is in higher managerial, professional or supervisory positions, while nearly triple the Preston average are self-employed (24.59%). This results in above Preston average household income at £43,192 plus. Crime rates are well below the Preston average and it also fairs well in nine out of ten indices of deprivation, making Barton a desirable place to live.

There are no Geological or Biological Heritage Sites within the parish of Barton, the nearest one's being in Goosnargh and Woodplumpton.







- **In the village is the late medieval Church of St Mary's in which can be found a well-preserved register dating back to the early 1600's.**
- This picturesque area includes the popular and scenic Beacon Fell Country Park, which is one of the oldest parks in the country, it was designated in as one in 1970.
- **The Country Park consists of 110 hectares (271 acres) of woodland, moorland and farmland. The summit is 266 metres (873 feet) above sea level and offers spectacular views of the Forest of Bowland and Morecambe Bay. On a clear day it is even possible to see the Isle of Man**

Goosnargh Parish is a true rural area and sits within the Forest of Bowland, a designated Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty. Beacon Fell National Park is within its parish boundaries. Being rural it has a severe lack of shops and services resulting in a high level of car ownership (96.2%) compared to the Preston average (68.57%). Being prime farming land it has a higher than average number of people working from home (16.55%) compared to Preston (4.41%). It has a fairly high proportion of middle and old-aged residents resulting in a large percentage of retirees (56.28%). The average house price of £362,510 is nearly double Preston's; with property type being predominately detached (64.6%). Despite this 48% own their home outright, compared to Preston (29.37%). Residents are mainly in higher managerial or supervisory positions (63.38%); while over triple Preston's average are self-employed (35.8%). This results in a higher household income than Preston's at around £43,192.

Crime rates are below Preston's average with Goosnargh being better than the Preston average in nine out of ten indices of deprivation. The percentage of people enjoying good or fairly good health in Goosnargh (94.77%) is higher when compared to the Preston average (89.67%). Goosnargh has three Biological Heritage Sites within its parish boundary.






Age Structure for Goosnargh and Preston Borough



Grimsargh is a rural village and parish, with farmland and open countryside surrounding it. It also has a large reservoir within the parish boundary. For a rural location it is well catered for in regards to services and amenities and has a regular bus service to and from Preston, meaning that car ownership is below (61.52%) that of Preston (68.57%). Although this is the case a greater percentage of people do drive to work (50.94%) rather than take the bus (3.01%). The average house price in Grimsargh is £307,338, which is higher than some surrounding parishes with many residents (43.54%) owning their, mainly, semi-detached homes. There is also a concentration of residents from 30 – 59 years old (44.38%) compared to ages 60 – 85 years old (21%) making it a good area for families with young or teenage children to settle. Conversely though, when looking at the statistics for the economically inactive, a large percentage (58.29%) are retirees, indicating that the Village and surrounding area has plenty to offer for a wide age range of residents. A new, large-scale housing development has also been built in the last few years, adding to the desirability of living there. A large percentage of employment is in higher managerial, professional or supervisory positions (64.71%), with average income being around £38,588.

Crime rates are low (46.63 per 1000 population) when compared to Preston (143.38 per 100 population). It also fairs very well in nine out of ten indices of deprivation, making Grimsargh a very desirable and sought after place to live. Grimsargh has Biological Heritage sites within its parish boundaries.





Haighton parish is the smallest of the eight parishes around Preston, with no facilities and amenities of its own as well as a very small population (197- Census 2001). It is farmland and open countryside with the majority of workforce self-employed (43.86%) four times that of Preston (9.58%). Strangely, despite the lack of bus stops and public transport, car ownership is below (48.79%) that of Preston (68.57%). The highest percentage of residents is aged between 50 and 70, with 51.35% being retired. The average house price within this area is £184,250, with many (49.37%) owning their mainly detached (65.88%) homes. This is not much higher than the Preston average (£156,223) indicating that the lack of services and amenities contribute to this figure. The crime rate is below (46.63 per 1000 pop) the Preston average (143.38 per 1000 pop) and it also does well in nine out of ten indices of deprivation. Employed residents are mainly supervisory and skilled manual workers, with the average salary being £38,588, only slightly higher than Preston's at £30,761.

The percentage of people enjoying good or fairly good health is very high (94.92%) though only 5.25% higher than the Preston average (89.67%). There is a biological heritage site within the parish boundary of Haighton.



Lea is semi rural and mostly agricultural land, with many farms merging or disappearing altogether over the last century. New build flats and houses now occupy large parcels of land. The ages of residents are fairly evenly spread across the board, though there is a spike at ages 30 to 39 (11.04%). The percentage of retirees is lower than surrounding parishes (44.2%) and only 7.71% higher than Preston's (36.49%). A high percentage of residents are in full time employment (65.07%) and the population is evenly split between the sexes (Male 49.04% - Female 50.96%). Employed residents are in mainly higher managerial, professional and supervisory positions (60.21%), what would be considered "young professionals", most probably couples with young children. A large percentage of residents enjoy higher than the Preston average (89.67%) of good or fairly good health in Lea (92.99%). There are four Biological Heritage Sites within the Lea Parish Boundary.









Whittingham parish is open countryside with the village of Goosnargh at the heart of it, though conversely only a small part of Goosnargh is within the parish of the same name, the majority is within Whittingham. It has some amenities and facilities, but lacks quite a lot and has no Primary or Secondary schools within the parish. The village of Goosnargh is a sought after place to live and this is reflected in the average house price being double (£362,510) that of Preston (£156,223). Nearly half of residents (45.18%) own their home outright, with the majority of house type being semi-detached (42%). Resident's age range is fairly evenly spread out, though there is a spike (9.3%) at ages 50-54, with above the Preston average (36.49%) of residents retired (48.84%). Of the economically active over half (53.19%) are in full time employment, though this is lower than the Preston average (59.73%). Of these, the majority are in managerial, professional and supervisory positions (57.22%), with average income at £38,588.

Crime rates are lower (46.63 per 1000 population) when compared to the Preston average (143.38 per 1000 population) and it does well in eight out of ten indices of deprivation.







Woodplumpton is surrounded by open countryside and farming land. As with most rural areas it has a lack of services, shops and amenities. It has a regular, though limited, bus service, but of those travelling to work only about half (50.53%) do so by car. The households with one car or more is a lower than expected figure (52.74%) given the area. The area has a higher than average (12.37%) percentage of people working from home compared to Preston (4.41%) but not as high as other similar parishes. It has a fair percentage of retired residents (47.82%), higher than the Preston average (36.49%) but only by 11.33%. The average house price of housing (67.4%) is £243,925. Although higher than the Preston average, it is not as high as other rural areas making it a more affordable area to live in, with a good percentage owning their own homes (40.72%). It also has a nearly half of residents retired (47.82%). A high percentage of residents (68.08%) are in higher managerial or supervisory positions, with the average income high at £43,192.

Crime rates per 1000 of population are low (25.84) compared to the Preston average (143.38) and it does well in nine out of ten indices of deprivation. Woodplumpton also rates highly in residents enjoying good or fairly good health (93.76%), which is higher than the Preston average (89.67%). Woodplumpton has both Geological and Biological Heritage sites within its boundary.






