

## 1. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1** Chorley Borough is located in the part of northwest England where southern Lancashire adjoins Greater Manchester. It is approximately 25 miles to the centre of Manchester and the large urban centres of Blackburn, Bolton, Wigan and Preston are all within a 12-mile radius. The Borough extends to about 205 km<sup>2</sup> (approximately 80 square miles). In the east of the Borough are sparsely populated upland areas forming part of the West Pennine Moors. On the lower slopes are stone built villages. The central part of the District between the M6 and M61 motorways is more built up, with the principal market and former mill town of Chorley and to the south the industrial/former mining townships of Adlington and Coppull. To the north and west of Chorley town are the settlements of Clayton-le-Woods, Whittle-le-Woods and Euxton, which have expanded considerably through suburban developments since the 1960s. The west of the Borough is typically lowland countryside, which becomes flatter further to the west as it becomes part of the Lancashire Plain. Here, red brick built villages are characteristic, the largest being Ecclestone and Croston.
- 1.2** This community profile study has been undertaken to help gain an understanding of the role and function of different settlements in the borough. This work will provide guidance and inform decisions about how suitable settlements are to accommodate further growth and development by providing a palette of social, demographic, environmental, economic and transport characteristics of the each settlement. It is hoped it will also act as a useful reference source for Council staff and Members, external organisations, community groups and members of the public.
- 1.3** This study will form part of the evidence base for the Local Development Framework, which will replace the current Local Plan, and supplement the **Chorley Profile**, which provides a comprehensive picture of the district. - 1.4** Thirteen community profiles produced in total ranging from the rural areas of Brindle and Hoghton to the urban area of Chorley town.
- 1.5** Ward-level 2001 Census data has been used to produce datasheets for each community along with data provided by Lancashire MADE Public, Lancashire Profile, Indices of Deprivation 2007, Thomson Local and Lancashire County Council's Mapzone application. Information regarding the location of certain facilities was provided by Chorley Council's geographic information system. Community and parish websites were also a useful source of information.

# Adlington and Anderton

## Location and Description



The villages of Adlington and Anderton are situated at the southern end of Lancashire, approximately three miles south of Chorley. The villages are served by the A6 going towards Chorley in the north and Horwich and Blackrod in the south. The Leeds-Liverpool canal runs through Adlington and the West Pennine Moors are within easy reach.

There are good communication links by road and rail with the larger towns in the area and the villages boast a wide range of essential services including shops, schools, churches and community facilities, including a library & a marina on the canal. The M61 motorway passes to the east.

## Characteristics

### +VE

- Adlington railway station ensures that a higher than average proportion of residents within the community use the train to travel to work compared to the borough average.
- House prices are approximately £20,000 less than the borough average.
- Total recorded crime is below the borough average.
- The ward fares well in the Indices of Deprivation 2007 with the rank in 8 of 10 categories being above the borough average.
- The proportion of key-out-of-work benefit claimants is lower than the borough average.

### -VE

- GCSE point scores are lower than the borough average.
- The proportion of residents classed at social grade AB falls below the borough average by 2%.
- A high percentage of the population of Adlington travel between 10km-20km and 20km-30km to work suggesting that they commute to larger towns and cities such as Wigan, Bolton, Preston and Manchester.
- 67% of residents reported 'good health compared to the borough average of 69%.
- Average household income falls below the borough average by around £1,500.

### OTHER

- Property and business services account for 26% of local businesses, followed by construction (13%) and retail (10%).
- The provision of sports grounds and parks is below the borough average.
- Many occupiers own their homes outright; almost 7% more than the borough average.
- A higher percentage of the population is aged 55 or above compared with figures for the borough.

## SOCIAL GRADE (AGED 16+)





# Astley Village and Buckshaw

## Location and Description



Astley Village is situated to the northwest of Chorley town centre and can be seen as an extension of the town's residential area. It was a purpose built village, constructed in the 1970s and is within easy reach of the motorway network at junction 8 of the M61.

Buckshaw Village is a new residential and industrial area between the towns of Chorley and Leyland in Lancashire. It is one of the largest urban development sites in the North West of England. Road connections nearby include the motorways M6 and M61, as well as the A6 and A49 roads. A new railway station is proposed on the Manchester to Preston railway line between Leyland and Chorley.

### +VE

- 28% of local people travel less than 2km to work compared to the borough-wide figure of 18%. Likely working destinations are the Regional Investment Site at Buckshaw and Chorley town.
- Average house prices are over £10,000 less than the borough average.
- Average household income is £36,990, above the borough-wide figure by over £1,000.
- High percentage of local people report good health or fairly good health.

### -VE

- Total recorded crime is above the borough average.
- Provision of parks and sports grounds is below the borough average.
- The ward fares poorly in the Indices of Deprivation 2007 with the rank in 7 of 10 categories being below the borough average.
- GCSE point scores are slightly below the borough average.
- The proportion of key-out-of-work benefit claimants is 14.4%, above the borough average of 10%.

### OTHER

- Property and business services account for 36% of local businesses.
- The proportion of homes that are detached is 14% above the borough average with less terraced and semi-detached dwellings.
- 29% of dwellings are social rented accommodation from housing associations, exceeding the borough-wide figure by 22%.
- The proportion of local people in social class AB is above the borough average yet there are also high numbers in social classes D and E.

## SOCIAL GRADE (AGED 16+)





# Brindle and Hoghton

## Location and Description



The villages of Brindle and Hoghton are set in the north of the Borough near the boundary with Blackburn. Brindle is located between the hills, yet easily accessible from the A6, which passes through Clayton Green. As a beautifully kept village offering excellent links to nearby towns including business centres such as Preston, Bolton, Chorley and Manchester, Brindle could be described as a commuter village although the village still retains a strong sense of local identity. In 1997 the M65 cut through the village, ensuring that traffic heading between Leyland and Blackburn, rightly by-pass the narrow lane through the centre of the village.

### +VE

- Average household income is £46,144, above the borough-wide figure by over £10,000.
- Total recorded crime is below the borough average.
- The ward fares well in the Indices of Deprivation 2007 with the rank in 7 of 10 categories being above the borough average.
- The proportion of key out-of-work benefit claimants is considerably below the borough average.
- Average GCSE point scores are above the borough average.

### -VE

- The average house price is over £300,000, more than £120,000 above the borough average.
- Due to the rural nature of the area 72% of local people travel to work by car.
- Car ownership is high with 94% of homes owning at least one car.
- The provision of semi-natural and institutional open space is above the borough average although other types of open space fall below the average borough provision.

### OTHER

- 15% of local people work from home, while 34% travel 5km-10km to get to work. Likely commuter destinations include Preston, Blackburn and Chorley.
- 23% of local businesses are property and business services while 18% are agricultural.
- Almost 50% of all homes are detached dwellings.
- 43% of residents own their homes, 10% above the borough average. Private renting is also above the borough average at almost 9%.

## Location and Description



Charnock Richard is situated on the main A49 leading from Preston to Wigan. The town is located to the East of the M6 while Heskin Green is situated to the West. Although located adjacent to the M6 residents living in either village must travel north or south to access the motorway via junctions 27 and 28.

Located in the area is Camelot Theme Park, which opened in 1984, and Park Hall. Charnock Richard Pasture is just off Freemans Lane and is a Site of Special Scientific Interest. Charnock Richard services can be found between junctions 27 and 28 of the M6 motorway. It was the first service station on the M6 motorway when it opened in 1963.

# Chorley

## Location and Description



Chorley is located at the foot of the West Pennine Moors and is bisected by the A6 Roman road which goes straight through the town centre. The town is also near to the M61 of which Junction 6 and 8 serve the town. In addition the M6 motorway serves the west of the town with Junction 27 connecting the town to the motorway.

Chorley railway station provides runs between Manchester Airport and Windermere, Manchester and Preston, and now links direct to Scotland without changing. The Leeds and Liverpool Canal runs parallel to Chorley and several marinas and locks are located in the Chorley area.

# Clayton and Whittle-le-Woods

## Location and Description



The village of Clayton-le-Woods is divided in two by Cuerden Valley Park and the River Lostock. Situated to the north of Chorley, Clayton-le-Woods is 7 miles from Preston and next door to Leyland and Bamber Bridge. The eastern part, Clayton Brook and Clayton Green, borders Whittle-le-Woods. The area is bounded by the A6 road and the M61 and M65 motorways, and is conveniently near the M6 motorway.

Whittle-le-Woods is located on the A6, about three miles north of Chorley. It is divided into two areas, the older part on the old coach road running through Waterhouse Green to Brindle and the more modern part on the A6 road. # Coppull

## Location and Description



The village of Coppull is sandwiched between Chorley to the North and Wigan to the South (approx 8 miles) and neighbours the town of Charnock Richard. The main A49 road cuts through the western edge of the village, and is just skirted by the M6 motorway a little further to the west.

# Euxton

# Heath Charnock and Rivington

## Location and Description



Heath Charnock is a small village on the edge of Rivington reservoirs and is situated to the south east of Chorley town centre.

The village of Rivington lies below Rivington Pike and further east is Winter Hill, which was a location for the 2002 Commonwealth Games. The village extended a little further to the west until 1847 when Liverpool Corporation began the construction of the Rivington Reservoirs. The two reservoirs were completed in 1857, five years later than Anglezarke Reservoir to the north.

Numerous nature trails and walks within the area are a popular focal point for hikers and ramblers. Rivington Country Park boasts a visitor centre and contains reservoirs, woods and moors making it a great destination for walking.

# Pennine

## Location and Description

# Wheelton and Withnell

## Location and Description



Withnell parish is set to the north east of Chorley town centre on the A674 to Blackburn. The A674 and A675 provide excellent access to the M61 (Junction 8) and M65 (Junction 3). Withnell is about five miles (8 km) north-east of Chorley itself and about 5 miles (8.0 km) away from Blackburn.

Wheelton is divided into two parts - Higher Wheelton and (lower) Wheelton. This area can be found on the main road from Chorley to Blackburn. Wheelton has tiny sloping streets, giving an accurate impression of the surrounding hilly countryside, with Briers Brow being the steepest. Part of the village borders the Leeds Liverpool Canal.

The area is a hive of activity during the summer months as the tourists narrowboats ply their way along this stretch of the canal.






### 3. COMMUNITIES COMPARISON

**3.1** By comparing and ranking settlements in a range of demographic, economic and social subject areas it is possible to identify how settlements are performing in relation to surrounding areas. This chapter will provide data to enable a comparison of all communities.

#### Population


**3.2** Table 1 shows that Chorley town is the largest settlement in the borough in terms of population followed by Clayton-le-Woods and Whittle-le-Woods. The rural wards of Heath Charnock and Rivington and Brindle and Hoghton have the smallest populations.

**3.3** Table 2 shows how population density varies between settlements. Chorley town is the most densely populated settlement in the borough followed by Clayton-le-Woods and Whittle-le-Woods.


**Table 2: Ward population per square km** (Source – Office of National Statistics)


**Table 3: Proportion of resident working age population estimates claiming out-of-work benefits** (Source – NOMIS)



## Crime


**Figure 1: Total recorded crime rate per thousand population** (Source – Lancashire MADE public)

3.5 Figure 1 shows the rate of total recorded crime throughout the borough. Eccleston and Mawdesley has the lowest crime rate (20.86 per thousand population) while Chorley town recorded the highest crime rate (97.03 per thousand population).

## Income

3.6 Table 4 displays the average household income for settlements in Chorley borough. The rural settlements of Pennine, Brindle and Hoghton, and Heath Charnock and Rivington are shown to have the highest mean income. The largest settlements in the borough have the lowest mean household income with Chorley town, Coppull and Adlington and Anderton showing income levels below the borough average.


**Table 4: Mean Household Income 2008** (Source – CACI Ltd)

3.7 House prices vary greatly throughout the borough from a low of £133,700 in Coppull to a high of £366,000 in Heath Charnock and Rivington.


**Table 4: Average House Price 2008** (Source – Hometrack)



## Deprivation

- 3.8** The Index of Multiple Deprivation 2007 combines a number of indicators, chosen to cover a range of economic, social and housing issues, into a single deprivation score for each small area in England. This allows each area to be ranked relative to one another according to their level of deprivation. The Indices of Deprivation 2007 have been produced at Lower Super Output Area level, of which there are 32,482 in the country. - 3.9** Figure 2 shows deprivation at a settlement level. Rankings, as shown of the map, were reached by finding the average rank of Lower Super Output Areas within each settlement. Chorley town, Astley and Buckshaw, and Coppull are ranked in the bottom 20% of settlements in the borough. Pennine, Euxton and Eccleston and Mawdesley are ranked in the top 20% of settlements.

## 4. DATA SOURCES

**4.1** The majority of the data used to produce the community profiles was taken from the 2001 Census (Office of National Statistics). The following 2001 Census datasets were used:

**Approximated Social Grade (UV50):** This dataset is about Approximated Social Grade. It shows all people aged 16 and over living in households by their approximated social grade. Social Grade is the socio-economic classification used by the Market Research and Marketing Industries, most often in the analysis of spending habits and consumer attitudes. Although it is not possible to allocate Social Grade precisely from information collected by the 2001 Census, the Market Research Society has developed a method for using Census information to provide a good approximation of Social Grade.

**Land Use Statistics (Generalised Land Use Database):** This dataset provides land use statistics in square meters, from the Generalised Land use Database (GLUD)

**Number of Rooms (UV57):** This dataset is about Numbers of Rooms. It shows all occupied household spaces by how many rooms there are in the accommodation.

**Qualifications (UV24):** This dataset is about Qualifications. It shows the usual resident population aged 16 to 74, by their highest level of qualification. The highest level of qualification variable was derived from responses in the 2001 Census to both the educational and vocational qualifications question, and the professional qualifications question.

**Accommodation Type - Household Spaces (UV56):** This dataset is about Accommodation Type. It shows all household spaces by the type of accommodation (including if they are in a shared or unshared dwelling).

**Distance Travelled to Work (UV35):** This dataset is about Distance Travelled to Work. It shows the usual resident population aged 16 to 74 in employment by the distance travelled to work. The distance travelled to work is measured in kilometres of a straight line between the residence postcode and the workplace postcode. It is not calculated for people working mainly at or from home, people with no fixed workplace, people working on an offshore installation, or people working outside the UK.

**General Health (UV20):** This dataset is about General Health. It shows the usual resident population by a self-assessment of their general health over the 12 months before the Census.

**Cars or Vans (UV62):** This dataset is about Cars and Vans. It shows all households by whether there are any cars or vans owned or available to the household, and if so how many. It also includes a total count of cars or vans in the area. The number of cars or vans available for use, by one or more members of a household includes company cars and vans available for private use. The count of cars or vans in an area is based on details for private households only. Cars or vans used by residents of communal establishments are not counted

**Economic Activity (UV28):** This dataset is about Economic Activity. It shows the usual resident population by their economic activity status. Economic Activity applies only to people aged 16 to 74. It relates to whether or not a person was working or looking for work in the week before Census. The concept of Economic Activity is compatible with the International Labour Organisation (ILO) definition of economic status.

**Tenure - Households (UV63):** This dataset is about Tenure. It shows all households by whether they own or rent their accommodation and, if rented, whether it is rented from the Council, Housing Association/Registered Social Landlord, Privately rented or Other

**Method of Travel to Work - Resident Population (UV39):** This dataset is about Method of Travel to Work. It shows the usual resident population aged 16 to 74 by the method of travel to work. Those people not currently working are shown separately. The method of travel to work is for the longest part, by distance, of the usual journey to work.

**Sex (UV03):** This dataset is about Sex. It shows the Usual Resident Population and the split between Males and Females.

**Religion (UV15):** This dataset is about Religion. It shows all people by religion stated. As the religion question was voluntary, missing responses were not imputed for this question. Those who did not answer this question are included under the 'Religion not stated' category of the variable.

**Ethnic Group (UV09):** This dataset is about Ethnic Group. This variable was created from responses to the ethnic group question in the 2001 Census. The ethnic group question records each person's perceived ethnic group and cultural background. The tables covers all people, and shows the detailed 16-way classification of ethnic groups.

**Key Out-of-Work Benefits:** Department of Work and Pensions - Key out-of-work benefits consists of the groups: job seekers, incapacity benefits, lone parents and others on income related benefits. The percentage figures show the number of benefit claimants as a proportion of resident working-age people.

**GCSE Point Scores:** Department for Children, Schools and Families - Average GCSE and Equivalent Point Score Per Pupil at the End of KS4
